

This quarter we are pleased to announce the recipients of the MCBF scholarships and grants.

The \$1,000 Judge Ronald E. Vican Scholarship was awarded to Kiaya Jones for her excellence in academics, sports and community service. Kiaya was unable to attend the ceremony as she was already attending classes at Notre Dame.

We were excited to have families join in on the celebration as we awarded four very deserving students with a \$1,500 scholarship each. Teagan Angell is attending Fordham University where she'll major in Government. Kayla Clare will be heading to Penn State Harrisburg to focus on Government and Law. With a focus on criminology, Mia Edma will be attending George Mason University. Megan Hughes plans on a career in law enforcement after graduating from East Stroudsburg University.

The extension of our deadline to apply for grants resulted in the receipt of almost \$200,000 in requests. After careful consideration the MCBF Board is pleased to announce the following 2021 grant recipients:

Clymer Library - \$4,500 for the purchase of laptops, printer with initial setup, and supplies, all of which will be mobile to allow social distancing by users.

Developmental Educational Services of Monroe County - \$3,560 for the purchase of iPads for use as visual learning tools for those with intellectual disabilities.

Eastern Monroe Public Library's new Smithfields Branch - \$4,500 for the purchase of technology in support of Civic, STEM and early literacy programs for the new facility.

Garden of Giving - \$12,000 to expand and increase production of fresh vegetables and fruits for those in need by building training beds for children and raised beds for seniors.

Monroe County Habitat for Humanity - \$10,000 for the home preservation project which will assist in the completion of 30 home preservation projects.

Kettle Creek Environmental Fund - \$20,000 in support of environmental education programs through the 2020-2021 school year for the four public schools in Monroe County.

Pocono Area Transitional Housing - \$21,000 for the PATH program which provides temporary housing and support services for families with children experiencing a housing crisis in Monroe County.

Pocono Mountain Public Library - \$4,500 for the purchase of technology for use by lower income families unable to afford computers.

The Friendly Community Center - \$5,000 for the purchase of equipment for the Wellness and Arts Program with a focus on the aging population in Monroe County. The equipment will allow for live broadcasts.

ELECTION BOARD DUTIES

Polling Place: Open 7:00AM to 8:00PM

Election Board consists of a Judge of Elections, Majority and Minority Inspectors, Machine Inspector and Clerk. Board members must be at least 18 years of age and be a registered voter in Monroe County.

All board members should plan on arriving at the polls at 6:00 am and leaving after 8:00pm when paperwork is complete. Training classes are available each election; poll workers attending will be paid \$20 for the class.

JUDGE OF ELECTIONS

- Paid \$125 for the day, \$20 for picking up the supplies the day before the election, \$20 for returning the supplies to the Election office on election night, \$20 for attending class (class is mandatory for the Judge of Elections for the Primary election only), \$5 for personal cell phone usage.
- This position is elected every four years. If there is a vacancy during this timeframe, the Board of Elections will appoint for this position.
- Contacts all board members prior to Election Day; updates any changes in address & phone numbers, confirms availability to work and lets the Election office know if there are any vacancies to be filled and informs all board member with the time required which is 6:00 am to be at the polling place on Election Day.
- Contacts the polling place prior to Election Day to find out how to get in and to be sure they have the necessary equipment set up for them. (If your polling place will allow this)
- Picks up supplies at the Election office the day before the election.
- In charge of the polling place on Election Day.
- **Prior to 7:00 am once the Minority Inspector administered the Election Officers' Oath (in the white box) to you, you will administer the oath to the other poll workers and have each person sign (2) copies of the form where appropriate and place one in copy in Envelope A and one copy in Envelope B.**
- Helps with the voting machines.
- Makes sure all machines, paperwork and poll books are set up and ready by 7:00 am when polls open.
- Processes provisional voters.
- Serve as contact person for questions, problems or issues that arise during the day.
- Helps to close the machines, process absentee ballots, write-in votes and close polling site at the end of the day.
- Is responsible for processing and returning all paperwork, machine cartridges and election returns to the Election office on election night.

MAJORITY & MINORITY INSPECTORS

- Paid \$120 for the day and \$20 for attending class. (Primary election only)
- Majority and Minority Inspector positions are elected every four years. If there is a vacancy during this timeframe the Board of Elections will appoint someone for this position.
- Majority and Minority Inspectors should be of different parties (However, we accept any person willing to work at the polls regardless of party).
- Must arrive at polling location at the time established by the Judge of Elections which is 6:00am to prepare the poll place for voting.
- Inspectors are in charge of the poll books and make sure all eligible voters sign in before voting.

- **Majority Inspectors** performs duties as assigned by the Judge of Election, assist in activating the machines for voters.
- **Minority Inspectors** will administer the Election Officers' Oath to the Judge of Elections prior to anyone fulfilling their duties on Election Day.
- **Minority Inspectors** performs duties as assigned by the Judge of Election, is responsible for returning election materials at the end of Election night with the Judge of Election to the County Board of Elections. Keeps **Envelope B**, which holds a set of election returns of extra copy #2 of the results from each machine, canvass sheet/return sheet, one Elections Officers' Oath, yellow copy of Number List of Voters for two years.
- Helps to close the machines, process absentee ballots, write-in votes and close polling site at the end of the day. May not leave until all paperwork is complete.

MACHINE INSPECTORS

- Paid \$120 for the day and \$20 for attending class (class attendance is mandatory for machine inspectors Primary election only).
- This position is appointed by the Board of Elections.
- Must arrive at polling location at the time established by the Judge of Elections which is 6:00 am to prepare the poll site for voting must have machines open and operable promptly at 7:00 am.
- Answers all voting machine questions throughout the day, and helps with the operation of the machines to voters who are unfamiliar with the equipment. Sets the machines for each voter throughout the day.
- Helps to close machines, process absentee ballots and write-in votes at the end of day. May not leave until all paperwork is complete.

CLERKS

- Paid \$120 for the day and \$20 for attending class. (Primary election only)
- This position is appointed by the Minority Inspector. If there is a vacancy, the Board of Elections will appoint someone.
- Must arrive at polling location at the time established by the Judge of Elections which is 6:00 am to prepare the poll site for voting.
- Assist in opening the polls.
- Fulfill all duties as assigned by the Judge of Elections.
- Keeps a voting record on the **Number List of Voters** throughout the day.
- Helps in closing the polls, process absentee ballots and write-in votes at the end of day. May not leave until all paperwork is complete.

ATTENTION

No board member may go home until all paperwork is completed. All machine usb drives, poll books, paperwork and paper work must be dropped off by the Judge of Elections at the Election office on election night!
