**DANIEL P. LYONS**  
**1955-2020**

The Monroe County Bar Association, in conjunction with the Court of Common Pleas, hereby promulgates this Memorial Resolution to celebrate the life and commemorate the distinguished career of Daniel P. Lyons who suddenly died on August 16, 2020.

Dan was born on March 3, 1955 in East Stroudsburg, one of three children of Edward and Marie (Stofflet) Lyons. Dan graduated from Stroudsburg High School in 1973 and attended Indiana University of Pennsylvania where he graduated, with honors, in 1977. After graduating with honors from the National Law Center of George Washington in 1982, he worked as an associate with the firms of Hiscott and Robinson in Stroudsburg as well as Christine and Christine in East Stroudsburg. He served as an Assistant District Attorney, and became a partner in the firm Primrose, Lyons and Quigley, leaving the firm in 2004 to practice as a sole proprietor.

He was a solicitor for Tunkhannock Township, as well as for local Zoning Hearing Boards and Planning Commissions, and many homeowners Associations in Monroe County for over 30 years. His general practice included criminal defense, personal injury, business law and commercial transactions, family law, estate planning and administration, civil litigation and residential real estate. Dan was a custody master for ten years, and represented many banks at Sheriff Sales, and participated at Mortgage Diversion Program conciliation hearings.

Dan was very active in the community. He served on the Board of Directors of Head Start, now known as Pocono Services for Families & Children, for 11 years, (6 years as President), the Board of Directors of Meals on Wheels for 12 years, (6 years

as President), the United Way's PARD Committee for 8 years, Finance Committee for 5 years, and Board of Directors for 3 years. He was Secretary of the Board of Directors for the Monroe County Bar Association for 2 years, and a member of the Rotary Club of the Stroudsburgs for 8 years.

Dan enjoyed his lunches with Bill Cramer and Tim McManus, and other notables who joined them from time to time. One of their waitresses at Brownies in the Burg and the Yard of Ale said Dan felt like family.

Dan was an avid sports fan and a huge follower of the Seton Hall University Men's Basketball team. Additionally, he was a member of the Glen Brook Golf Club and enjoyed his weekly outings with his fellow Stroudsburg High School Alumni. He also supported his daughter's soccer teams and coached YMCA youth soccer, baseball and basketball. Dan enjoyed spending time outdoors, traveling, and collecting antiques. But most of all, he loved family time and letting his dog romp in the backyard creek.

Dan is survived by his wife of 29 years, Kimberly, and their daughter, Shannon. He was preceded in death by a brother, David, and by a sister, Margaret.

We deeply and sincerely regret Dan's passing.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT WE, THE MEMBERS OF THE Monroe County Bar Association, of which Daniel P. Lyons was a member, adopt the foregoing Memorial as expressive of the loss which the Bar, the Bench, the Community and this Commonwealth has sustained by reason of his death, and that we tender his family, legal associates and friends our most sincere and heartfelt sympathy, and be it
