Background: It has been common practice in the United States to make felons ineligible to vote, in some cases permanently. Currently, individual state approaches to felon disenfranchisement vary tremendously. In some states incarcerated felons never lose their right to vote. In a majority of states felons lose their voting rights only while incarcerated. In other states, felons lose their voting rights during incarceration, and while on parole and/or probation. Finally, in other states felons lose their voting rights indefinitely for some crimes, or require a governor's pardon for voting rights to be restored, face an additional waiting period after completion of sentence (including parole and probation) or require additional action before voting rights can be restored.

Question: With the different state laws regarding voting qualification as a backdrop: Should there be one, national policy (law) that allows or restricts a felon from holding the office of the presidency. (Defend your answer in the space below)
